If you're behind on your electricity or natural gas bill and are worried that your service may be disconnected you may qualify for emergency financial help through the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP).

Customers who meet income eligibility can get up to \$650 in emergency assistance for their electricity bills (\$780 if their home is heated electrically) and \$650 for natural gas bills.

1. The Homelessness Prevention Program

The Homelessness Prevention Program helps eligible York Region residents, who are homeless or at risk of homelessness not receiving Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Program benefits, to stabilize their housing.

To meet your emergency housing needs, we can help with costs such as:

- First and last months' rent.
- Rental arrears.
- Utility arrears.
- Utility security deposit.
- Utility reconnection fees.
- Moving costs.
- Assistance with mortgage payments or arrears.
- Landlord and tenant mediation.

Dental Programs

Canada Dental Care Plan

The Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) is helping make the cost of dental care more affordable for eligible Canadian residents.

Eligibility requirements

To qualify for the CDCP, you must meet all 4 of these requirements:

- You don't have access to dental insurance.
- You and your spouse/common-law-partner (if applicable) must have filed your tax returns in Canada so that your family income can be assessed for the previous year.
- Your adjusted family net income is less than \$90,000.
- You're a Canadian resident for tax purposes

You need to meet all the eligibility criteria to qualify for the CDCP.

Healthy Smiles Core Program – based on income through online application

Healthy Smiles Ontario is a government-funded dental program that provides free preventive, routine, and emergency dental services for children and youth who are 17 years old and younger and are from low-income households.

Any family with income below the program's income thresholds can apply each year to receive children's dental coverage.

CARE Tax Credit

The Ontario Child Care Tax Credit (known as Ontario Childcare Access and Relief from Expenses (CARE) Tax Credit) puts more money in the pockets of families and provides the flexibility they need to choose the child care options that work best for them.

Eligible families can claim up to 75% of their eligible child care expenses including services provided by child care centres, homes and camps.

You can claim this tax credit when you file your personal income tax return.

Drug Programs

ODB: Ontario Drug Benefit Program

Get help paying for prescription drugs when you qualify for the Ontario Drug Benefit program.

You will qualify for the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) program when you turn 65 years old. You will qualify before you reach that age because you're:

living in a:

- long-term care home
- home for special care
- Community Home for Opportunity

24 years of age or younger and not covered by a private insurance plan (OHIP Plus Program) receiving professional home and community care services receiving benefits from Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program

enrolled in the Trillium Drug Program

Low-Income Seniors Co-Payment Drug Program (SCP)

If you are a low-income senior or a senior couple with income below certain thresholds, you can have your Ontario Drug Benefit deductible waived and co-payment fees reduced to \$2 by applying for the Seniors Co-Payment Program.

Government Senior Citizens Programs

Canada Pension Plan - Retirement pension

The Canada Pension Plan (CPP) retirement pension is a monthly, taxable benefit that replaces part of your income when you retire. If you qualify, you'll receive the CPP retirement pension for the rest of your life.

To qualify for a Canada Pension Plan (CPP) retirement pension, you must:

be at least 60 years old have made at least one valid contribution to the CPP

The Old Age Security (OAS) program

The Old Age Security (OAS) pension is a monthly payment you can get if you are 65 and older.

In most cases, Service Canada will be able to automatically enroll you for the OAS pension if sufficient information is available. Service Canada will inform you if you have been automatically enrolled.

If you did not receive any letter about the OAS pension the month after you turned 64, you may need to apply for the OAS pension.

Guaranteed Income Supplement – Allowance

The Allowance is a non-taxable payment you can get if:

- The Allowance is a non-taxable payment you can get if: you are age 60 to 64
- you live in Canada
- your spouse or common-law partner is eligible to receive the Guaranteed Income supplement (GIS)
- your combined annual income is less than the maximum annual income threshold for the Allowance.

Ontario Senior Homeowners' Property Tax Grant (OSHPTG)

The OSHPTG is available to Ontario senior homeowners and seniors who have a life lease or a lease of 10 or more years that is paid in full, who pay property taxes or property taxes are paid on their behalf, and who have low or moderate incomes. It is an annual payment that seniors must apply for each year when they file their income tax and benefit return.



Canada Learning Bond (CLB) and Canada Education Savings Grant (CESG)

The Canada Learning Bond (CLB) is money that the government adds to a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) for children from low-income families.

How much does a child receive?

The Government of Canada contributes up to \$2,000 to a RESP for an eligible child. This includes:

\$500 for the first year of eligibility,

\$100 each year the child continues to be eligible (up to and including the benefit year in which they turn 15)

There is also Canada Education Savings Grant (CESG)


